Kim Hyojoung, Confucian Ethics in 21st Century Korea: An Empirical Assessment

■ Abstract

There has been much debate on whether neo-Confucian principles and practices of social organization has been instrumental to the economic development of South Korea or detrimental to her further modernization. Yet there has been little research that examines how much the traditional Confucian ethics has been practiced by contemporary Koreans.

The author attempts to fill the void by empirically analyzing the structure and dynamics of Confucian ethics in 21st century contemporary Korea.

■ Profile



Hyojoung Kim, Ph. D., received his B.A. in Political Science at Yonsei University, M.A. in Sociology at the University of Connecticut, Storrs, and Ph.D. in Sociology at the University of North Carolina, Chapel Hill. He is currently Professor of Sociology and Director of the Center for Korean American and Korean Studies at the California State University-Los Angeles.

His main research and teaching areas include political sociology and race and ethnic studies with special emphasis in Korean and Korean American studies. His research has been published in various internationally acclaimed academic journals, including American Sociological Review, American Journal of Sociology, and European Sociological Review.

Choi Youngjae, “Politics of News Media: How the Biased News toward counterpart countries are produced in South Korea and Japan”

■ Abstract

In the current situation where the relationship between Korea and Japan has deteriorated, the news media of both countries are reporting, sometimes attacking the other country from their respective patriotic perspectives. It is often far from objective, true coverage, and sometimes misleads people with fake news. This research illuminate, from the media sociology and media politics theory perspectives, how the press, and the public interact to produce this biased-framed news. The capability of democratic citizens’ news literacy to critically read and filter this biased news is discussed.

Youngjae Choi is a professor, the Media School, Hallym University, South Korea since 2004. He earned Ph.D. in the School of Journalism, University of Texas, Austin. His research interests are president and media, issue management, media sociology, media policy and research method. He if the former Vice President of Academic Affairs in Hallym University.

Dr. Choi has done public service as a board member of News Agency Promotion Foundation, the largest stockholder of Yonhap News Agency, and was a board member of YTN Radio. He has worked as a journalist for YTN (24-hour Cable News Channel in Korea, 1995-2000) and Yonhap News Agency (1989-1995). He frequently has written analytical columns and articles of politics and journalism in national newspapers and journals in Korea.
